Course Description:

The Academy will introduce students to academic research and prepare students to engage in undergraduate research. Students will participate in a variety of workshops facilitated by peer mentors and complete an array of assignments in conjunction with those workshops. Material is evaluated on a pass-fail basis; thus students will earn either a pass or fail grade at the end of the course. Current students will be registered for Summer C 2013; transfer students not yet enrolled at UCF will be registered for Fall 2013.

Course Requirements:

Attendance throughout the entire academy is mandatory. Completion of the academy requires that students participate in all workshops/events and complete all required assignments before, during, and after the academy.

Course Objectives:

- Explore the definition of research across multiple disciplines
- Identify the skills learned during an undergraduate research experience and learn how to apply these skills to a variety of career paths
- Learn how to identify and approach potential faculty mentors about undergraduate research
- Highlight the basic expectations and requirements of the undergraduate researcher when conducting research with a faculty mentor or in a professional environment
- Provide participants with a solid foundation in research ethics, both conceptually and in an applied manner
- Emphasize to participants the importance of strong communication skills to establish and maintain a productive relationship with a research mentor
- Meet faculty and students engaged in research
- Provide participants with a general understanding of the opportunities for and demands of graduate studies
- Explore UCF research programs and opportunities
- Explore information sources and understand the differences between primary and secondary literature
- Explore research writing and how to put together a literature review

Peer Research Mentor Role:

Each student will be assigned a Peer Research Mentor who will be their guide during SRA. Peer Mentors will communicate all assignments to their assigned students, collect assignments, and keep attendance. If you have any questions or concerns please contact your mentor.
